

Gilbert (Gil) Taylor 26/1/1872 - 13/2/1941

For service to his community, to agriculture and to his country.

Gilbert Taylor born on 26 January 1872 in Tingwall, Shetland Islands, was the first child of Walter Taylor and Agnes Tait, who married on 24 January 1871. The couple had three more children born while living in Tingwall – Catherine, Jane and Thomas.

In 1876 Gilbert, known as Gil, while still a young child, left from Gravesend, England, with his parents and siblings on board the ship *Somersetshire*, arriving in Port Phillip Bay on 25 August, 1876. Walter and Agnes began farming on a property at Dean named *Tingwall*. The couple had another son, Thomas Joseph who was born in Dean. Gilbert was educated at the Dean State School and later the Creswick Grammar School situated in Cambridge Street. Each day after school he worked for his father on the family farm.

Gilbert married Jane Neuss in July 1896 at Mollonghip with the ceremony performed by the Rev Charles Robinson. Jane was the daughter of George Neuss and Mary Ann McKendry from Happy Valley. The couple had seven children – Walter, George, Thomas, Mary Ann (Dolly), Robert, Arthur and Gilbert.

After the marriage, Gilbert and Jane at first leased a farm in Dean, then in 1903 purchased a farm at Dean named *Fairview*. Gilbert was a progressive farmer being among the first in the district to use a Jelbart tractor. He was an expert self-taught mechanic and was often in demand to diagnose and repair farm machinery among the local population. He was a champion ploughman, winning a competition at Smeaton Agricultural Show in November 1893. His expertise at growing potatoes was to hold him in good stead when he spent World War I in England as an Agricultural Instructor.

Later in life, Gilbert was a successful breeder and exhibitor of Clydesdale horses, including the champion stallion *Lord Dunbar* from imported stock. He was a gifted civil engineer in the construction of roads, dams and drains. One achievement, it is recorded, was the construction of the Dean-Creswick Road.

He was a Board Member of the Creswick District Hospital and served as President during 1906-07.



Gilbert was a dedicated public minded citizen, taking an active role in local civic affairs. In September 1910, he was elected as a Councillor for the Shire of Creswick after a close contest with Mr Henry Collins. Gilbert won by one vote. He served as a Councillor until 1921.

The *Creswick Advertiser* reported on 4 September 1914, that Gilbert was elected President of the Shire. At the same Council meeting, the President's allowance was fixed at twenty-six pounds on the motion of Councillors Fletcher and Nase, being an increase of one pound from the previous

year, equal to ten shillings a week.

Gilbert's term as President of the Shire of Creswick was an anxious time for a district largely dependent on agriculture, being in a drought and with conditions made more difficult by the First World War.

Other positions held by Gilbert were as a Justice of the Peace, President of the Dean Mechanics Institute, Committee member of the District Agricultural Society, the Higher Elementary Schools Old Boys and Girls Association and a member of the Scrub Hill Presbyterian Church. As noted in the records of *Victorian Places, Dean*, Gil was a member of the delegation which, through persistent lobbying of the then local member, (Minister for Education and eventual Premier) Alexander Peacock, led to the Dean school becoming Victoria's first Higher Elementary School in 1911.

The *Clunes Guardian* on 5 June 1917 reported '*Councillor Gil Taylor, JP, of Fairview Farm, Dean, a member of the Creswick Council, has enlisted in place of his son.*' Gilbert said at the time, '*My son has just reached military age and to my mind is not sufficiently developed to leave for the front. Rather than see the family unrepresented in the war, I preferred to send myself,*' and that he was going with the full consent of his family and his wife.

On 12 June 1917, the *Creswick Advertiser* states, '*At Creswick Shire Council meeting on Thursday ... he was granted six months 'leave of absence' and 'that the Councillors would see that his seat would be kept for him.'*

HONOUR ROLL INDUCTEE - 2023

Gilbert (Gil) Taylor

Gilbert enlisted in the AIF on 2 August 1917, when he was forty-five years old. On enlisting, Cr Taylor was discharged in Melbourne on the grounds that he was too old. Gilbert enlisted a second time and by lowering his age was accepted for service overseas. His unit embarked from Melbourne on HMAT A38 *Ulysses*. He served with the 38th Battalion, 8th Reinforcement.

On arrival in England Private Taylor was told that no men over forty years were allowed to serve on the front line. In April, 1918 he was attached as a Cadre to 4 Command Depot at Hurdcott, Wiltshire responsible for training the rest of the unit. Being an experienced potato farmer, his services were utilised as an agricultural instructor. During his time there, the camp produced six hundred tons of potatoes for the army.

On his discharge, Gilbert returned to Australia in December, 1918. It was reported in the *Ballarat Star* on 7 February 1919 –

'SOLDIER COUNCILLOR: CR G. TAYLOR RETURNS WELCOMED BY CRESWICK SHIRE COUNCIL: Kingston. A cordial welcome was extended by the Shire of Creswick to Corporal Gilbert Taylor who took his seat for the first time in about two years after having been on service with the Australian Expeditionary Forces.'

Gilbert resumed his position as a Councillor where he continued to represent the people of the Shire of Creswick until August 1921 when ill health meant he was not able to continue in this role. Gilbert moved to Melton on a Soldier Settlement Allocation where he continued farming and was employed by the Melton Shire.

Gilbert died on 13 February 1941, and he and his wife Jane, who pre-deceased him, are buried together in the Creswick Cemetery.

Gilbert Taylor, an agriculturist and civil engineer, served his family, his community, his State and his Country

CRESWICK TRAILS

Construction is well underway on the Creswick Trails, Council's network of 60km of mountain bike trail located in the State Forest, Regional Park and plantation lands just outside of Creswick. Works are progressing steadily with some great new trails coming together. The Hammon Park Trailhead has been recently completed and has a lot to offer including a play area, learn to cycle track, cycling jumps, nature play, a sand pit and a great cubby house.

If you're out walking in the bush, you may see areas blocked off by orange bunting. This area may be part of our construction site. We ask that you please avoid the freshly constructed trails and the construction corridor for your safety as well as that of our trail builders.

While we're disappointed that our trails won't get to host the Commonwealth Games, we are excited to open the trail network for our community, which is expected to be in December 2024.

BOWLING GREEN PROJECT



Work is underway on the Creswick Bowling Club green redevelopment project. Some dry weather has allowed for work to gather pace. The construction contractor has been able to set up the site, remove the existing green, carry out screw pile testing, and install the stormwater discharge point.

The contractor will soon carry out the remaining earthworks and commence installation of the sub-base screw piles.

INVESTING IN OUR ROADS

Council is investing in roads across the Shire, with a \$500,000 road patching contract awarded at its July Ordinary Meeting. Works will start in spring once the weather improves. We also recently partnered with five other councils to deliver a regional approach to bituminous resealing.

In our 2023/24 budget we have allocated \$2.73 million to reconstruction, resealing and gravel re-sheeting of roads across the Shire, in addition to around \$3 million of operational expenditure for other repair works. This investment in these assets will continue to improve our roads and community safety.

Kingston Friends of the Avenue News

The 105th anniversary of the first planting of the Avenue of Honour at Kingston was marked on 10 August, 2023. On that day in 1918, 225 trees were planted by the community of the former Shire of Creswick. The average life expectancy of an elm is 120 years.

On 10 August, 2018, an elm was planted in the township of Kingston to commemorate the centenary of the first planting. Catherine King MHR, Member for Ballarat, planted the tree assisted by the great-great-nephews of William John Grigg (Tree No. E 41), who served in the Light Horse in Egypt.

William Grigg was born at Newlyn and returned to the family farm after the war. He died at the age of forty-two from malaria contracted during the war and is buried at the Creswick Cemetery. Every tree holds family stories.

In 2022, Kingston Friends of the Avenue commissioned Homewood Consultancy to prepare a Tree Management Plan (TMP) which will soon be accessible via our website. In line with the TMP, the condition of each tree has been assessed and recommendations made about replacing those reaching their Useful Life Expectancy (ULE). A Veterans Affairs Grant has provided the opportunity to commence this work. It is so important that the Friends continue to build connections with Avenue families as this work progresses in 2024, in partnership with Hepburn Shire Council and Heritage Victoria.

The following trees have been identified in the TMP as the first to be replanted.

- . Tree E52 - Lennon Edwin Coulson
- . Tree E53 - Charles Joseph Finlayson
- . Tree E54 - Frederick Francis Crisp

- . Tree W58 - Samuel McKay Gard
- . Tree W81 - Robert William Waddington
- . Tree W89 - Cornelius Harold Robert Toll

Can you help find families connected to these people? If so, please get in touch as soon as possible so relatives can be involved and supported through this transition.

Book Review By Rhonda Cotsell

I had the privilege recently of meeting Allendale author Dianne Cramer, who I discovered is also the mother and mother-in-law of the gardening pair who for years have created miracles of order in my garden. Love the way country connections happen.

Dianne has written an interesting and entertaining biography, *More bits, and other bits: more than an Odyssey*, which follows on from *City girl goes bush: an eleven year odyssey*, written and published in 2017. Both are stories of family, friendship and days full of connection, love and action.

The second part of her biography is rich with detail and action covering years from 1966 when she and her husband left a central Australian cattle station and moved to South Australia then to Victoria. It covers the intervening years until they settled again. Then came retirement, followed sadly by widowhood.

The writing style is conversational, lively and full of little details. Dianne told me that her biographies are based on the daily diary entries she has made all her life, noting down quickly the things done, events that occurred and her thoughts and feeling in the recollection on looking back on them. This emerges in the style, creating a strong image of someone stopping briefly in their day to jot down the things that mattered enough to be quickly recorded.

The opening sentence is, for example, *'We'd done it'*, introducing immediately a sense of adventure and change. In the same early pages she speaks of their arrival and how, *'strapped for cash'* she applied for a position in Henschke vineyards while her husband worked at Keyneton (SA). The voice is positive and live, telling us of the favourite wine they discovered, why they stopped buying it and, after telling us about a wonderful dessert for a red grape pudding called Rote Grutze, giving the recipe. I was hooked from then on.

The rest of the book has the same feel, moving fast paced through their life, full of interesting and intricate little side details that give depth to the life unfolding between its pages. It is also generously filled with colour photographs from the family album giving visual details to the accompanying text. Photos range from people, portraits and groups, recording deeply felt moments – one instance where two are farewelling one another from a church retreat in the Phillipines, to objects and places from the big to the small including cakes, trucks, buildings and family knee-deep in work.

August 17, 1923

A meeting of present and intending members of the

Creswick District Anglers' Club will be held at the office of the secretary (Mr. J. B. Mader) this evening at 7 o'clock. A good attendance is desired.

August 21, 1923

The Kingston Fire Brigade will hold a euchre tournament in the Kingston Mechanics' hall on Wednesday (tomorrow) Evening, in aid of the funds of the Creswick District Hospital. Prizes will be given. The admission is 1/ each.

August 24, 1923

That most enjoyable fixture, the annual Catholic Ball, takes place in the Creswick town hall tonight (Tuesday), and promises to equal its predecessors as being the dancing event of the season. First class music has been secured, the floor will be in tip top order and the catering in the hands of the ladies will lack nothing.

August 31, 1923

The attention of woodcutters and all others willing to give assistance is called to the fact that the annual woodchop for the Creswick District Hospital will take place tomorrow (Saturday). The area to be cut over is Block No. 2 Plantation, which is adjacent to the railway line between Creswick and Bald Hills. The Hospital authorities have been granted the right to cut up to 70 cords of firewood.


This year, Creswick Community Garage Sales is a joint project with the Creswick Market which will host a limited number of garage sale stalls in conjunction with the normal monthly market day.
