Creswick Garden Lovers Weekend Saturday 10 and Sunday 11 November 2018



The 5th annual Creswick Garden Lovers Weekend was another huge success for Creswick and surrounds, attracting people from all over the state and beyond. In total there were 2444 garden visits to the six delightful and varied private gardens open to the public.

Many people had never visited Creswick previously, and commented on the beauty of the region, the friendliness of the people they met, and how they would return to explore the region further. Visitors shopped, ate and stayed overnight or longer and spent money in our businesses – exactly why the event was held. The weather was warm and sunny, ideal for exploring gardens!

The participating private gardens were all in the Creswick Township this year: *Charnwood*, featuring exotic and native plants; *Ophir*, an artist's garden, quirky, different and fun; *Noonameena*, a large country garden with sweeping lawns, trees, roses, and perennials; *Rossmore*, a true cottage garden in full bloom using lots of imaginative ideas; *Mon Repose*, featuring 2.5 acres of mature trees with many delightful garden features; and finally *Alberton*, an inspired courtyard garden using artistic pieces reflecting the talents of the owners.

Commercial nurseries also participated. Lambley Nursery, Overwrought Sculpture Garden & Gallery, Newlyn Antiques & Cottage Garden Nursery, Bells Water Gardens, Maze House, Brenlissa Nursery, Spring Park Nursery and Creswick Nursery in Miss Northcott's Garden partnered with us this year.

Our community partners this year were John Curtin Aged Care, The Creswick Garden Club, the Creswick Neighbourhood Centre, the Ballarat Bonsai Society and all our wonderful local volunteers who assisted with ticket sales and visitor information.

The Garden Lovers Weekend is organised by Business & Tourism Creswick with funding support from Hepburn Shire Council. The purpose of the event is to provide an economic boost for local businesses by promoting our town and region. Profits are used for local Creswick and district projects. Last year \$1,000 was donated to the Kingston Avenue of Honour committee. Two projects of particular interest to Business & Tourism Creswick Inc. are the refurbishment of the Buried Rivers of Gold Drive and Ride Trail, and the Magic Pudding Playground, with the committee working to bring both these projects to fruition.

A Small Slice of History SUPERMARKET

As the new supermarket rises on the eastern side of Albert Street, and a steady stream of sober patrons emerge from the (former) *British Hotel*, the *For Sale* sign on *Foodworks* window strikes a note for history. Not since 26 March, 1871 has the site been vacant, when the original *British Hotel* and two adjoining shops were razed by fire. Contrary to some belief, these buildings had been saved from the 1860 Great Fire, which led to the 1861 formation of the Creswick Volunteer Fire Brigade.

The vacant blocks were sold three months later - and here's food for thought. The *British* corner, with Albert Street frontage of twenty-six feet and 234 feet depth, sold for £399 (£9/15/- per foot). The second block realised $\pm 302/10/$ - and the third £248/5/-.

Those Albert Street prices indicate land values in Creswick's growing commercial area. A then local comparison might be found in the sale of large residential blocks on Church Hill for ± 3 .

Any comparison with this century is fraught with danger, not only because of the change to decimal currency. In the lead-up to Federation, the Australian colonies dealt in British silver and copper coins and newly minted Australian sovereigns (worth about £1) and half sovereigns. When the light dawned on the futility of transporting gold back to England, and returning it as coin, Mints had been erected in Sydney and Melbourne.

However back to the fire of 1871. Rev Thomas Williams (artistic Lindsays' grandfather) was preaching that morning at the Wesleyan (Victoria Street) Anniversary Services. Hearing the fire bell, he quickly pronounced the Benediction, and strode down to assist the Volunteer Fire Brigade. Three other clergymen (Revs Pyne, Williams, and Coombe) were also seen 'working lustily' to avoid a repeat of the 1860 disaster.

The Rev Pyne, of the Church of England, is recorded for his assiduous efforts in the 1869 establishment of the Creswick Grammar School.

The *Creswick Advertiser* (27 March, 1871) reported the first flames had been seen issuing from the garret window of the hotel servant's room, the blaze then destroying the main building and the two adjacent shops. Fortunately, the wind was blowing from the south, otherwise nothing could have saved that western side of Albert Street from another disaster.

The Advertiser noted, 'The Fire Brigade members worked willingly, with a daring and sacrifice in every way praiseworthy. We must not forget, however, to mention a complaint of Captain Orr and other members of the Brigade about the want of police protection'. Apparently the crowd hindered operations. 'The hydrant was broken and couplings severed. If the Brigade were unmolested, they would have managed things effectively, and had the fire more under control some time earlier. We trust the Fire Brigade will weekly thoroughly test their apparatus, so that when their aid is required they may be able to promptly and effectively render it.'

Rev Thomas spent his afternoon resting (?) with his grandson, Percy, in the first family home (not *Lisnacrieve*) before leading Evening Worship, at the Victoria Street church.

The Advertiser (March 24) had written of him, 'We need say nothing of a minster so popular and so deservedly esteemed save than to express a hope that he will receive the gratification of preaching to a crowded church'. After the Service, the Advertiser editor wrote, Rev Thomas 'preached to a large congregation, who appeared to fully appreciate the words of wisdom of their old minister and superintendent'.

The fire of preaching is never extinguished! As for thirsts, *The British* erected a temporary bar the following day!

A small crowd gathered at the Creswick Cenotaph to hear the story behind Battle's Over and the various events which would travel around the world. At 6:55pm, Creswick Light Horse Bugler - Suzi Koene with her World War I bugle played the Last Post - one of three buglers in Australia and 1,200 worldwide taking part and then followed at 7:05pm by Hepburn Shire Town Crier, Philip Greenbank who read the Cry for Peace Around the World. Philip was one of thirteen Town Criers in Australia and 224 worldwide who took part.

Finding Common Ground at Hammon Park



You might have noticed that construction of the long awaited asphalt pump track at the Hammon Park Trailhead site has begun. Trail builders from expert mountain bike infrastructure and consultancy company, *Common Ground*, will be calling Creswick home from now until Christmas, with the expectation to complete the work in that time frame. The project organisers look forward to seeing a gaggle of bike, scooter, roller-blade and skate board test riders on the track shortly after Christmas lunch!

For those new to the concept, pump tracks can be ridden by riders of varied ability on bikes, scooters or skateboards. They feature a series of interlinked loops of undulating track with banked corners or berms. Riders shift their body weight or 'pump' to generate momentum around the track. Asphalt tracks are the new industry standard and this alone will be a significant visitor draw card for Creswick.

Upgrade of the existing car parking will be the next development to take place at Hammon Park, with consultation sessions held on 3 December and construction of the 100km mountain bike trail network to begin early in 2019.

The Creswick Trails Project is funded by Regional Development Victoria for \$2.56m. For further information, contact Hepburn Shire on telephone 5348 2306.

100 years ago

Compiled by Creswick Museum

December 3, 1918

Rocky Lead – Flower day was duly celebrated in the local school, when competitions in flowers and school work were held. A splendid spirit of friendly rivalry was displayed among the exhibitors.

December 6, 1918

Next Sunday (8th) the Diamond Jubilee celebrations in connection with St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church will commence, when special thanksgiving services will be conducted by the Rev. W. H. McCook, B.A. Suitable music will be rendered by the choir. The committee hopes that all members and adherents will endeavour to be present at these services.

December 10, 1918

A meeting of the members of the church choirs and others interested will be held in the bank chambers on Wednesday (to-morrow) evening, at 8 o'clock, to arrange for a sacred concert on Christmas night, in aid of the local hospital.

December 13, 1918

Preparing for Epidemic- Pneumonic Influenza

A meeting was held at the local town hall on Tuesday evening of representatives of the Creswick Shire and Borough Councils, to decide on some line of action in the event of an epidemic of pneumonic (Spanish) influenza occurring in Australia and spreading to these municipalities.

December 17, 1918

Kangaroo Hills – Harvesting- Harvesting is in full swing round here, some good crops are being cut, and some very light ones. A large area is being put in for potatoes, and the rain will greatly improve them, thirty six points being in the last fall.

December 20. 1918

Several cases against lads for failing to attend military drill were listed for hearing at the Creswick Court yesterday, but owing to the inability of Mr. Harris, P.M., to attend, they were adjourned till 11th January.

December 24, 1918

Dean - The Higher Elementary School, at Dean, has again been unfortunate in losing one of its staff, Mr. Kennedy having been transferred to the Agricultural High School, Wangaratta. At the conclusion of the "Break up" festivities – when "Father Xmas" presented each child with a toy – a handsome leather suit case was presented to Mr. Kennedy in recognition of the valuable services rendered to the school and district during his short sojourn there.

December 31, 1918

Several Creswick Firemen visited the Talbot Boxing Day Sports on Thursday, and they participated in the distribution of the prizes. In the one man champion event Captain H. Bowley, off 2 yards, divided first and second with another competitor. The No. 2 Creswick team, comprising Captain Bowley and Firemen M. Heagney and P. Featherstone, took second prize in the three man disabled hose event.
