Who's heading up the team of keen volunteers you might ask? Well let's introduce them!

Adam Crutchfield (53) has lived in Creswick for over twenty years and is a local chef and small business owner of *Creswick Catering*. Across the year he has undertaken all Parkrun volunteering roles as well as completing a few runs too. Adam played a key role in setting up Calembeen Parkrun over a number of years, with it kicking off in 2023. He loves sharing the great town of Creswick with a great group of locals and visitors every weekend, while encouraging others to come and be part of Calembeen Parkrun.

The other two run Directors are Michael Parker (42) and Chrissy Austin (44) who have both lived in Creswick with their families for less time (six years each), but are equally passionate about Creswick and what Parkrun has done to connect the community. Michael, a civil engineer/partner at Axiom Consulting Engineers, is an avid runner and also a a volunteer with Parkrun. ### VOGA CYCLE CLUB – CRESWICK/VOGA SENIOR RIDERS BEGINNER CLASSES FOR ADULT CYCLISTS ANYONE BETWEEN THE AGES OF TWENTY AND NINETY

The VOGA Cycle Club has been successfully running regular rides for casual adult cyclists for the last five years and currently has twenty-two members. Over this period, these adult cyclists have become experienced riders, greatly increased their physical fitness and their ability, particularly in the distances that can now be easily ridden. The VOGA Cycle Club is endeavouring to increase the

number of casual adult riders in Hepburn Shire and surrounding districts. To this end, starting in late February next year, a beginner adult cyclist group will be formed. This does not mean we will be teaching people to ride, but rather getting those who have ridden bikes in the past back into cycling. Those who join this new group will be instructed on bike safety and maintenance, along with proper riding techniques. On-going rides in the district are guaranteed to increase participants fitness and the distances able to be ridden.

To this end, the VOGA Cycle Club will be holding a Beginner Cyclists Class on Thursday, 29 February starting at 10.00am at the Creswick Band Rotunda in Albert Street, Creswick.

The beginner cyclist class is **free** to any casual adult cyclist, or intended cyclist, and after a safety inspection and set-up of the bicycle, a short and supervised ride around Creswick will be conducted.

In recent years, electric bicycles have become very popular. The VOGA Cycle Club welcomes both conventional and electric bikes. Even if you currently do not own a bicycle, contact at the details listed below and the club will arrange for a bike, either conventional or electric, for you to try on 29 February.

Cycling is one of the best ways to greatly increase both muscular and cardio-pulmonary fitness and generate a general feeling of well-being. It is also a great way to meet other people in the district and generally enjoy an outdoor lifestyle.

Those intending to attend this class will be required, by law, to have an approved cycling helmet.

### Fire-safe Gardens By Rhonda Cotsell

I haven't written much about my gardening life for a while now, either here or in poetry at home, because there comes a moment when you realise that gardening is a very complex subject and outcomes are often unrelated to advice you receive or what happened last year. There is also the fact that the same things happen over and over again, and one day I felt I had nothing to say.

However, given the warnings we are getting about the coming summer, I wanted to just refer people to the excellent CFA guide for domestic gardens regarding preparation; what we should have in our gardens and what to avoid or consider altering. Our gardens are ongoing, ever-changing things, and we garden addicts change too, in how we want our gardens to look. Keeping fire safety in mind as one of the guiding principles is a good thing given our location and level of bushfire hazard. There is an excellent interactive map online called the *Climate Risk Map* provided by the Australian Climate Risk Council for those curious about such things. There is also an excellent CFA site located at How to Prepare Your Property/CFA (Country Fire Authority) where you can actually set your location and download Your Guide to Property Preparation (cfa.vic.gov.au).

My gardening decisions now have moved from weeding and pruning because I want my garden to look tidy, to identifying areas to work on in terms of fire. A camphor laurel that I cut back to a third of its height a few years ago because a small branch I tested in my wood fire burnt ferociously, is now on track for permanent removal because of that and also because it's a bit rampant. Recently I pruned new and some old growth back about two feet. I then crawled around the perimeter cutting away the lower levels to provide access to ground level and its interior and thinned back any new growth within it that I could reach.

I'm still non-stop weeding, pruning dead branches from bushes and working out what to do with past bad choices which are closer to the house than is ideal. So, still more of the same, but with a different intent.



### Quentin Turner 17/8/1939 – 31/3/2023

In any community such as Creswick, there are people who contribute a great deal to the successful running of their community, yet they seek no rewards and remain modest and humble in that community. One such person was Creswick's Quentin Turner.

Born and educated in Ararat, Quentin's working life began as an apprentice electrician. He worked his way up the employment ladder until he was Factory Foreman and Plant and Manufacturing Manager for Australian Timken at Ballarat as well as Human Resource



Manager. Once retired from Timken, Quentin worked as an Industrial Relations Commissioner mainly in Melbourne, principally in dispute resolution matters.

Quentin met Maisie Shearman in Ararat when they were both seventeen and dated for four years prior to getting married in 1961. Maisie, born in England, migrated to Australia with her parents and sister in 1951. The couple were married at the Ararat Presbyterian Church on 11 March 1961, made their home in Creswick and raised their three children here, Mandy, Penny and Jason.

As a member of the Creswick Branch of the Country Fire Authority Quentin made a huge contribution in this area and was awarded the highest honour paid to a volunteer fire fighter - the Australian Fire Service Medal (AFSM) for his lifelong contribution to the Victorian Volunteer Fire Brigade Association. Quentin was the Creswick CFA's longest serving Captain, a role he held for twenty-three years. During this time Maisie was President of the Ladies Auxiliary. The couple travelled all over the attending many Fire Brigade state Association competitions.

On passing the age for the physical work of firefighting, Quentin's contribution extended to becoming State President of the Victorian Urban Fire Brigades – a prime mover of the steering committee and inaugural Chairperson of the movement to bring the two groups together - the Victorian Urban Fire Brigades Association and the Victorian Rural Fire Brigades Association, then known as the Volunteer Fire Brigades of Victoria.

During his period of Captaincy, a training film was made by Crawford Productions, featuring the Creswick Brigade. This came about after the tragic fire at Streatham when several fire fighters lost their lives. Creswick had a serious fire at that time too, but the circumstances made it a totally different fire to fight and there were lessons to be learned from the Creswick approach. Quentin is proud of the fact that it was Creswick men who featured in that film and whose methods made it

such a worthwhile teaching tool.

Quentin's other interests in his younger days included long distance running; helpful for agility and speed when firefighting. Fishing, both fresh and salt water, could keep him happily occupied for hours. As members of a car club, Quentin and Maisie enjoyed many motoring trips both interstate and local. He admired and studied the great car manufacturers over the past century and the development of the motor car to what it is today.

Quentin and Maisie have been volunteers in the community for many years, including their long-term involvement with the Creswick Fire Brigade. Quentin spent ten years as a board member of the Creswick & District Community Bank. They were both volunteers delivering Meals on Wheels and they also volunteered for many years at the Creswick Visitor Information Centre. As well, Quentin was a member of the Sportsman's Club and Masonic Lodge.

Maisie and Quentin Turner celebrated their 60<sup>th</sup> Wedding Anniversary on 11 March 2021, with their family and friends. Eventually ill health put an end to Quentin's volunteering days. During his last months the couple were regularly seen at one of the local cafes catching up with friends and locals.

Quentin is survived by wife Maisie and the Turner family Mandy, Penny and Jason and grandchildren, Jordan, Hayden, Matthew and Dylan.


