

## Shannon's Bridge Needs a Helper!

A large section of Shannon's Bridge is the medical equipment area. Hospital beds, wheel chairs, hoists and other medical equipment, *is given for free*, to people in palliative care who are in desperate need. As part of this function, Shannon's Bridge is often called to Melbourne and surrounding districts to either deliver equipment or pick it up from families who no longer require it.

We have our wonderful Michael who organises the storage area and deliveries, but we need someone to help him.

This is a paid role which would entail:

1 - 2 days work per fortnight (these would vary depending upon requirements of patients);

Assisting to move and set up equipment (training would be provided);

Being fit, able to move the equipment and travel in a 4 tonne truck to Melbourne and other areas as needed;

Basic mechanical knowledge would be a plus.

## CALEMBEEN PARK WORKS

Works are progressing at Calembeen Park, with the path nearing completion. In parallel with the path and public amenity upgrade, new picnic furniture has been installed adjacent to the BBQ, and beside the toddler pool. A further path will be installed to link the main path with one of the picnic tables and the BBQ to improve accessibility. Three bench seats will be installed along the main path. With the area around the path now reopened to the public, work is now focused on the public amenity block upgrades. When completed there will be three unisex accessible change facilities with a toilet and shower in each. This work is expected to be completed by September.

## M D HAMMON PARK UPDATE

Works to construct the trailhead at Hammon Park are well underway. Using over 2,000 tones of locally sourced and recycled crushed rock, contractors have formed the base of the dirt jumps course, one of the highlights of the trailhead's infrastructure. Progress will continue over the coming months with completion expected in November. Council has accepted a tender to implement a new public toilet and amenities block at Hammon Park. The works will deliver three ambulant toilet cubicles, one accessible cubicle with shower and an accessible changing place. The toilet will be implemented in parallel to construction works at the trailhead.







#### CRESWICK TRAILS

The Creswick Trails network received its formal planning permit in January 2022, following extensive investigation into the site values and design work. #### 100 Years Ago

Complied by Creswick Museum

#### June 2, 1922

Correspondence – To the Editor – Sir,- Permit me space in your columns to advise the gentleman who paid me a visit on Monday night, not to come back again and try to open my front window, as I have notified the police. I also warn the same individual that for the future my gun and cartridges will be handier than they were on Monday night last. – Yours, etc., James Sanderson. Red Gully, Creswick. 31/5/22.

#### June 6, 1922

The local Repatriation Committee for the Creswick Shire and Borough advertise that an area of land at Ullina, formerly portion of the Smeaton Racecourse and Ullina Park, is available for application by returned soldiers holding qualification certificates. Application should be made to Mr. Chas. J. Joy, land officer, Ballarat, on or before Friday next. There is also an area of 170 acres available on the Mount Mitchell Estate.

#### June 9, 1922

Residents of the town and district are reminded of the great public welcome to be tendered to Commissioner Richards, the new Territorial leader of the Salvation Army, which take place in the Creswick town hall this (Friday) evening. Other prominent Army officers will assist the Commissioner. It is hoped that the hall will be crowded.

#### June 12, 1922

Returned soldiers or dependants of returned soldiers willing to act in the position of postmaster or postmistress at Springmount are requested to at once notify Mr. W. J. Bowley, secretary of the Local Repatriation Committee.

#### June 16, 1922

The "battle of the sites" was fought again at the annual meeting of the Smeaton, Spring Hill and Bullarook

Agricultural Society on Wednesday. The committee had recommended that the site at the rear of the Kingston Railway station be purchased for show purposes, and this recommendation was adopted by 26 votes to 20. Cr. Arthur R. Stewart, the president of the Creswick Shire Council, was elected to the presidential position in the society.

#### June 20, 1922

WAKE UP! CRESWICKIANS! You want Football. The Creswick District Football Club wants your SYMPATHY & SUPPORT.

A meeting of Citizens, Players, etc., will be held in the Fire Station at 8 o'clock on Wednesday (tomorrow) Evening, when the matter of how best to place the Club on a sound footing will be discussed. Everybody who can – BE THERE. T. P. Cushing, Secretary.

#### June 23, 1922

The first instalment of machinery for the Creswick Brick, Tile and Potteries Ltd. has been landed here, which will be very satisfactory to local residents. Included in the machinery are such important parts as the pug mill and the tile press.

#### June 27, 1922

Mr. William Jory announces that it is his intention to carry on the old established business of his late father, Mr. Simon Jory, monumental mason, of North Creswick.

#### June 30, 1922

Motor Bus Service, between Smeaton, Allendale and Ballarat, EVERY FRIDAY, leaving Smeaton 9 a.m., Allendale 9.35 a.m.; leaving Ballarat on return at 3.30 p.m.


The Annual General Meeting is set for Sunday, 24 July 2022 at 3.00pm. Afternoon tea provided! All welcome.




# ST AUGUSTINE'S SCHOOL NEWS
