A Tale of Three Swans and an Unfortunate Pelican

Last month the Creswick & District Historical Society posted on these pages a newly acquired glass plate image of two ladies feeding the swans at Park Lake and posed the question of from when this photo might have dated.

Well, the answer to this question also involves a pelican. In 1892 Councillor Davies offered a pelican and a swan for Park Lake and the offer was accepted. In 1893 complaints were received that the pelican would destroy all the fish in the lake, the lake originally having been created as a fish pond.

Negotiations were undertaken with the Ballarat Garden Authorities to exchange the pelican for a swan. Ballarat Botanic Gardens agreed to supply a *pair* of swans, which is why you see three swans in this photo. But the offer of the pelican was declined. This did not bode well for the pelican, as two months later Councillor Davies informed Council of its death and that a friend had stuffed it, free of charge, and that he would make a present of it to Council.

So it seems that the image submitted by the Historical Society would date from 1893 onwards.

We look forward to seeing what glass plate image the Historical Society presents to us next!

The Creswick Cube What Is It?

Located in what was historically Market Square, this small structure was the original Information Centre, built for the Creswick Promotion Council in the early 1960s. Today it features five information panels that align with the Creswick Branding of History & Heritage, Forestry, Environment and Arts & Culture. The fifth display panel has a focus on Gold, being the thread that weaves the other aspects together to paint a picture of early Creswick.

The graphic design and printing was funded by a grant from the Public Record Office Victoria and was completed in December 2023 by the Creswick Railway Workshops Association Inc. (CRWA). New front signage was also added in keeping with the graphic design of the panels. The Project was approved by the Hepburn Shire.

An acknowledgement panel gives credit to Mr John Lambert who was a major contributor to the Project. John worked with CRWA Secretary, Ms Judith Henderson, throughout 2023, both volunteering many long hours of research. John provided a wealth of historical information and a myriad of photographs. His contribution was deeply appreciated.

In one sense, the Cube has returned to its original purpose of sharing information. It also houses an original fire hose reel, believed to be the inspiration for Norman Lindsay in his book, *The Magic Pudding*.

The students have started all core curriculum subject areas, as well as specialist areas like PE, Japanese, Art, Music, Drama and visits from the MARC Van.







The Minister for Local Government has announced a new electoral structure for Hepburn Shire. The changes will move our Shire from 5 wards with 7 Councillors, to no wards with 7 Councillors. There are three grant opportunities currently open for community groups.

Council's Quick Response Grants – support community groups who may have experienced an unforeseen disruption, urgent issue or to facilitate small projects. Grants of up to \$1,000 are available until the allocated budget is exhausted.

Biodiversity grants - this program supports communitybased projects that enhance and protect the biodiversity of our Shire. Council has committed \$28,000 to support community driven biodiversity initiatives in 2024. Successful applicants will need to demonstrate how their project links to the objectives of the Natural Environment and Biodiversity in the Sustainable Hepburn Strategy. Funding is available for projects that can demonstrate benefits to biodiversity via on-ground works or increase the public's interest and capacity to protect and enhance our biodiversity. For the first time, larger two-year projects will be considered.

Sustainable Hepburn grants - support community-based projects and initiatives that aim to reduce future impacts of climate change. Council has committed \$40,000 to support community driven sustainability initiatives in 2024. Funding is available for projects that align with the strategic themes from the Sustainable Hepburn Strategy and can demonstrate a reduction in greenhouse gas emissions, through reduced energy consumption, carbon drawdown or via the use of renewable energy in Community facilities across Hepburn Shire. Biodiversity and Sustainable Hepburn grants close on 8 April. More information at www.hepburn.vic.gov.au/grants

Changes to bin collection from 8 April



Principal of St Augustine's Primary School Michael Heenan

In Term 3 last year, Mr Michael Heenan was appointed Principal of St Augustine's Primary School, entrusted with continuing the school's 169 years of tradition.

On first meeting, Michael Heenan has a down to earth and welcoming personality. Indeed, he is very proud of his roots. He was the second youngest of ten siblings - five boys and five girls - born and raised in Kingsbury in Melbourne's north. When his grandparents first arrived from Ireland, they landed in Portland and became dairy farmers. His father moved to Melbourne when he was fifteen looking for work, and there he met Michael's mother in Brunswick. 'I had a humble upbringing - I remember the paddocks and bushland that surrounded us before Kingsbury was swallowed up by suburbia, playing along Darebin Creek and not coming home til it grew dark.' He thinks this is why he feels so comfortable in Creswick. 'It feels like coming back home.'

Michael attended his local Catholic primary school, Our Lady of the Way, and went to high school at St Joseph's in Abbotsford. After finishing high school, he had no real idea what he wanted to do. He had a few different jobs, including working for the railways and baling hay. Eventually, he decided on teaching and attended Mercy Teachers College, now part of Australian Catholic University. Since then, Michael has worked primarily in the Catholic sector, teaching and then in leadership positions in western and northern suburb schools, including Mother of God Primary School in Ardeer, and St Clement of Rome Primary School in Bulleen. In 2008, he was appointed Head of Primary at Ivanhoe Grammar Junior School, where he stayed until 2012.

Michael felt very much at home at Bulleen as the school community's Italian background reminded him of his many Italian neighbours in Kingsbury growing up. Michael has an obvious soft spot for all things Italian. Last year, before taking up his position at Creswick, he spent a month of long service leave travelling around Italy in a Fiat 500 with his wife, enjoying the food and hospitality of small towns and villages off the well-beaten tourist tracks.

After a long career in suburban schools, Michael looked forward to a tree change when he applied for the Principal's position at St Augustine's. Turning off the M8 to Creswick, the countryside reminded him of Ireland, with potatoes and canola crops on either side of the road. He is currently staying with friends in Ballarat two days a week and commuting to Creswick from Essendon the other three days, which he has not found too arduous so far – 'It takes about the same time as driving from Essendon to Bulleen each day'. Nevertheless, both he and Melissa are looking to buy a house in the district. They have three grown children (one still at home). Michael favours modern art and architecture, but loves old cars. He is also a keen off-



road cyclist and has ridden around both Spain and Italy in the past few years. He enjoys exploring the gravel roads around the district and goes for rides a couple of times a week after school.

Michael calls himself a teacher by trade and is keen to deliver the best academic outcomes for the children at St Augustine's. He is very interested in the *Science of Learning* - a cognitive and research-based strategy for teaching based on how children actually learn. The friendly and supportive local community is very much a plus as far as Michael is concerned. He is very happy to reciprocate this support by encouraging local tradies and businesses. He has started regular Friday afternoon sausage sizzles at school for children and their families, which are great **getting-to-know-you** opportunities. *The children and parents are lovely.'*

Michael Heenan declares he is not a complex person. 'I was raised to be nice to people.' Surely, it is this quality of empathy and desire for the best for St Augustine's school and its community that can only enhance the important part it continues to play in Creswick's history.



March 18, 1924

The Creswick branch of the A.N.A. will hold spelling bees

at 8 o'clock tomorrow (Wednesday) evening, at the hall, in which the school children will take part. They will be divided into three classes – 7^{th} and 8^{th} , 5^{th} and 6^{th} , and 3^{rd} and 4^{th} grades – and good prizes will be given. Parents and others are invited to be present.

March 21, 1924

With a view of accelerating the delivery of correspondence to addressees by postmen, it has been approved that, from the 1st of July, 1924, delivery by such means be made only to such buildings and residences as are equipped with a receptacle in which correspondence can be deposited by the postman.

March 25, 1924
