

# St Augustine's Church 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebrations

The historic bluestone building of St Augustine's Church, standing on the hill in Napier Street, was opened in September 1872 and stands testament to the pioneers who had the vision to work towards its construction and opening. While records show that the first Mass was celebrated for Catholic miners and their families in the district in 1855, and the first Church/school was opened in 1856, it was not until 1870 when Fr Shanahan was Parish Priest that construction started on the current church building.

As quoted in the book Saints and Sinners written for the 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary, 'the bluestone came from Tallent's quarry at Dean. In the 1970s, the Sheridans, long associated with the Springmount district, recall stories of their grandfather, contractor Thomas Martin, hewing some of the stone and carting it in drays, free of charge – as his contribution to the building.' Descendants of this and other pioneering families are still active members of St Augustine's parish today.

In writing about the history of the church you are also writing about the history of Creswick and district. Church records show the ups and downs of the local district as gold discoveries came and were exhausted, with the population of the town following suit. The Registers of Baptisms, Marriages and Deaths show large numbers from the 1860s to the 1890s with a decline by 1900 when gold mining faded.

There is also a button below this information which will take you to the cemetery mapping system. This allows you to put in the information of your person and shows where in the cemetery to find the grave site. On the right hand side, click on *zoom to site* and it will show exactly what side of the row to find the grave. The information on the right also shows who else may be buried in the same grave.

#### LIONS SKIN CANCER CHECK AND AWARENESS UNIT VISITS CRESWICK



The Lions Club of Creswick was proud to host the Lions Skin Check Van on Saturday, 17 September and Sunday, 18 September. A big thank you to those who came out in such

bleak, wintery conditions to be screened. The three fully equipped clinic rooms were well heated throughout each day ensuring a comfortable environment for exposing skin.

Over the two days, volunteer dermoscopists (skin cancer screeners) provided a total of 109 full body skin checks. Of the 109 people screened, thirty-eight were referred on to their GP with suspect lesions requiring further investigation, proving the value of the free service in ensuring urgent needs are addressed.

Importantly, forty-four of the people attending had never been screened before. Hopefully their visits will create new habits including an annual skin cancer check and the need to take care of their skin daily.

In August, the club ran a very successful fundraising barbecue at Bunnings, Ballarat. Lions also assisted recently with the running of the regular ballroom dancing function at the Ascot Town Hall.

As I watch them, I wonder, where have you come from and where are you going? Changing shape in the wind constantly, nobody else watching is seeing the same cloud that I am watching in exactly the same way. We all see them differently, from different angles.

Clouds become metaphors in our lives also. From a cloudy day in our life, a 'dark cloud' hanging over us, to no clouds at all sung by the great Ella Fitzgerald in *Blue Skies* (and Willie Nelson come to think of it). So many songs and poems about rain!

Like the clouds, friends also seem to drift through our lives. Some fleetingly give us great joy, entertainment or insights. Some drift through at a snail's pace with us for years, decades even. The books I read, the music I listen to, the other artists I admire or influence my own work are all clouds drifting through my life that affect me in one way or another.

When you look at a cloud, try to remember everything about it. How high was it? What shape was it? Where was it going? I ask this because I think remembering is important in our lives.

I have a theory, that when we die, we kind of stay around somehow, as long as we are remembered -- only when nobody still living remembers us, that is when we return to stardust. Not very scientific I know, but that is what I feel.

For my own part, a big, dark cloud hangs over me at the time of writing. My beloved cat of nineteen years, Milly, died in my arms at five o'clock in the morning of September 6. She was my rock and my confidante, my one still point through many trying years, occasionally a pain in the bum also. I buried her at sunrise that morning in her favourite spot in the garden. The sun came up and lit up a most wonderful blanket of orange clouds in the east. Another, very special cloud passing through my life.

# **Clunes Show 160<sup>th</sup> Birthday**

Not too many community organisations get to celebrate a 160<sup>th</sup> birthday but that's what will be happening when Clunes stages its local show on Saturday, 19 November, 2022.

Originally formed as the Glendaruel Agricultural Society, it underwent several name changes until in the 1960s it became the Clunes and District Agricultural Society, the name by which it is still known today.

Entrants to the 1868 Show were invited to display in the following categories: - *Pair of plough horses, Swine, Salted butter not less than 12lb, Two cheeses not less than 8lb.* Under the heading, Extra Exhibits, came an unusual collection including *Bone dust and superphosphate of lime, 200 bricks made in Clunes,* and even a pair of swans hatched under a Spanish hen!

Almost 100 years on, the Committee of the 1964 Show invited entries to the Ladies Broom Throwing Competition. Miss Margaret Cameron was a formidable competitor, winning the event with an amazing throw measuring 96ft 10in. That same Show advertised a Tyre Changing Competition and a Ladies Wood Chop.

This year the Show welcomes the inaugural **Clunes Show Strongman Exhibition.** An **interactive Grain Arcade** will also be on display where the young and young at heart can get a feel for what it is like to harvest a crop using the **virtual reality header simulator**. Bring your own ferret for the **ferret racing competition**, or other pets for the **Pet Show**. This year marks the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the **Clunes Show Bute Ute Competition.** There will be wood chopping displays, a full complement of agricultural competitions, local entertainment, food, wine and much more.

This year's 160<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Show offers a great, fun day for the whole family and the Society would love to see you there.



A hundred years later, there was an increase in marriages during the 1960s to the 1990s as the influence of the Dutch migration was reflected in the population of the district.

The Anniversary celebrations took place over the weekend of 17 - 18 September when the inclement weather was a reminder of the difficulties faced by the pioneers. The Celebratory Dinner, held on Saturday night at the Doug Lindsay Reserve, attended by approximately 100 people, was a night of catching up with friends, some not seen for many years, reunions, reminiscences, making new friends and, through a light hearted fun quiz, learning about the history of the church; in all an enjoyable social evening.

The Concelebrated Mass the next day was presided over by Bishop Paul Bird, Bishop of Ballarat, along

with retired Bishop Peter Connors, former Parish Priests Fr Bill Melican and Fr Gary Jones, Fr Adrian McInerney, nephew of Monsignor James McInerney, Parish Priest from 1951 – 1983, and current Parish Priest, Fr Justin Driscoll. Many parishioners, current and former, and students attending St Augustine's School, participated in the liturgy of the Mass and joined in the singing.

At the end of the Mass, Neil Doolan, a member of the organising committee, thanked the many, many people who had contributed in some way in the organisation, preparation and delivery of the liturgy of the Mass and every other aspect of the weekend.

Those present then moved over to the School Hall for a display of photos and memorabilia. Current and former

parishioners, having returned for the day, were soon catching up with childhood friends and busy looking for themselves in the photos on display.



#### **100 Years Ago** Compiled by Creswick Museum

#### October 3, 1922

The Creswick Methodist Tennis Club intend opening the season on Saturday afternoon next, and district clubs are invited to send representatives to the opening function. The election of officers has been held and the following appointed – President, Rev. R. Whitford; secretary Miss R. Bowley; treasurer, Miss L. Bailey; captain, Mr. F. Bailey; match committee, Miss R. Bowley and Messrs. F. Bailey and D. Kerr.

#### October 6. 1922

Work at the new show yard site at Kingston is now proceeding daily, so that the ground may be in order for the show next month. A working bee is to be held tomorrow (Saturday), commencing at 9 am, when the principal work will be the erection of the fence. It is hoped that there will be a very large attendance of workers.

#### October 10, 1922

Allendale – The members of the local Fire Brigade and the Allendale Cricket Club gathered in strong force on Monday evening of last week, when a presentation of a clock, suitably inscribed, was made to Captain G. Hobill, as a wedding gift, on the occasion of his marriage. The presentation was made by Mr. Jno. Svanosio, secretary of the brigade, and good wishes were conveyed by Messrs T. McDonald, A. Byron, Les Crane and A. Roberts. Refreshments being served his "health and future happiness" was drunk with enthusiasm.

#### October 13, 1922

Kooroocheang – The Lucynvale golf links here were a lively scene on Saturday last, when Mr. and Mrs. G. Sewell gave a return tournament to Mr and Mrs. D. Walls, who were the originators of this club. In addition to the members,

there were several visitors from Newstead, who took part in the play, and expressed themselves delighted with the afternoon's sport.

#### October 20, 1922

Much satisfaction and pleasure is felt by residents that a start has been made with the erection of the works of the Creswick Brick, Tile and Potteries Ltd., at North Creswick. The contract for building three 3-down draught kilns and a chimney about 60 feet high has been let to Mr. W. Crowle, of Melbourne.

#### October 24, 1922

A meeting of the Members of the Smeaton Tennis Club will be held on Wednesday (tomorrow) night, at 8 o'clock in the Mechanics' Institute. A good attendance is desired. F. W. Redman, Hon. Secty.

#### October 27, 1922

A meeting was to have been held last Tuesday evening, to make the preliminary arrangements for the annual carnival in aid of the Creswick District Hospital. However, many were prevented from attending owing to other engagements, and it was agreed that a meeting be held next Tuesday evening at the Town hall.

#### October 31. 1922

Allendale - The Gale - considerable damage has been done by the violent and boisterous gale that began on Saturday night and continued without cessation on Sunday. Many trees were uprooted and fences blown down, besides buildings being stripped of much material and roofing. A serious loss will result to many graziers, who are now engaged shearing, as many of the shorn animals have succumbed through the intense cold, and numerous dead carcases are to be seen in the paddocks.



# Kingston, Friends of the Avenue Inc.

On Wednesday, 28 September, Vicki Johnson and myself conducted a tour of the heritage precincts and significant places in Kingston and district. The tour started in Blampied and took in Hepburn Lagoon, the ruins of the Birch brothers' home, Keerin's Bridge, Kingston township and the Avenue of Honour, then over the shoulder of Spring Mount, which afforded a panoramic view of the path of the proposed transmission lines and the mullock heaps of the *Buried Rivers of Gold*.

At the 1872 Deep Lead Monument in Broomfield, the *Buried Rivers of Gold* self-drive tour began (available from the Creswick Information Centre) and travelled past the sites of the old mining hamlets of Hollinwood, Jerusalem and onto Dibdin Town, over the Monash/Wheelers Bridge Lawrence to Smeaton. Then past Anderson's Mill and back to the historic Kingston Show Grounds for lunch. On the way back, the site of the proposed terminal station was viewed. Thanks to the Councillors, Council staff and Steve Wroe CEO of the Daylesford Macedon Tourism Board for participating, and in particular Damien Kennedy for his organization and Eddie for driving the bus.

The Bunnings Sausage Sizzle raised over \$2,000, to be shared with the Kingston Agricultural Society. Many thanks to all volunteers and special thanks to the team captains Jenny McKinnon (KFOA) and John Rowlands (KAS). At Anderson's Mill, there was a steady stream of visitors who were keen to listen and learn about the Avenue, the Western Renewable Link Project, *Buried Rivers of Gold* and especially the Kingston Open Garden. Thanks to the volunteers who made it possible to cover the two days.


